According to a filing with the Securities and Exchange Commission, Merrill Lynch & Company has granted an \$8.2-million stock incentive bonus to its executive vice president and general counsel, Rosemary T. Berkery. The grant of 85,573 restricted shares will trickle in in four equal installments, the first of which is slated to arrive on January 31, 2008.
